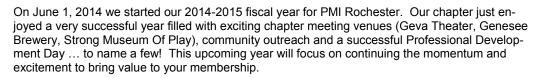

chapter Meeting Highlights

March 2014

The March chapter meeting was held at Champion Hills Country Club in Victor. The main presentation focused on quality management systems (QMS) development, delivered by Ernie Newcomb. His discussion was a condensed exploration of the process for developing a formal quality management system based on the ISO 9001:2008 quality system standard. A major requirement of a QMS is the continuous improvement of the quality system. This is accomplished by using various statistical techniques that identify opportunities for improvement which result in the assignment of problem-solving team projects. Also covered were various tools that teams use to solve these problems include various methodologies such as value-stream mapping, failure modes and effects analysis (FMEA), Six-Sigma DMAIC, and design of experiments (DOE).

April 2014

For our April program, PMI Rochester took time to acknowledge all of its hard-working volunteers at Strong National Museum of Play through a volunteer recognition event. All volunteers in attendance were given a certificate and PMI embossed umbrella as a thank you for their dedicated service. The night's main presentation featured a light-hearted look at what can be learned about project management from those classic masters of comedy, the Marx Brothers. Chris Adams was supposed to be the featured speaker, but had to cancel at the last moment. But fortunately Groucho Marx made an appearance and delivered the comical yet informative program himself.

After the program ended, attendees were escorted to the eGames Exhibit, equipped with tokens courtesy of PMI Rochester, and invited to walk down memory lane reminiscing in the video games of their youth. Great fun was had by all. Our own president Brian Gregory got a new all-time high-score on Ms. Pac-Man. You should have been there!

June 2014

The June chapter meeting was held downtown at Nixon Peabody. The program represented the PMI Rochester chapter annual meeting where our president Brian Gregory review some highlights from the past year, including financial summaries and membership updates.

In addition, the main presentation focused on project schedule management given by Burt Kleinman, CEO of a local consulting business focused on improving productivity through the utilization of project management and Lean Six Sigma. He also teaches several business classes at RIT, including a graduate level project management class. Burt recently retired after 35 years with Xerox holding many field and HQ positions, most recently as a VP, US Supplies.

Burt's discussion reviewed and explored many core scheduling concepts from the PMBOK, WBS importance, critical path identification, resource over-allocation, network diagramming, and PDM methods. During the Q&A portion of the presentation, Burt fielded many inquiries from attendees regarding current project scheduling challenges they are facing. Much was learned by all.

News You Can Use

In our last newsletter, the 5 Steps in PMI Ethical Decision-Making Framework (EDMF) created by the PMI GOC (Global Operations Center) were provided for guidance to a PMP trying to determine if something is unethical. This newsletter, I would like to discuss its purpose, background and how to use it.

As the EDMF states, "The PMI Ethical Decision-Making Framework (EDMF) document describes steps that can be used to guide an individual in the project management profession through a process to make a decision when confronted with an ethical dilemma."



The PMI EDMF document supplements the PMI Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct in order to assist a project management professional confronted with an ethical dilemma. The document was developed over a one-year period by an international team of PMI volunteers with the assistance of a recognized ethics expert and was recently released to the PMI community. Therefore, if you have any comments or questions about this document, please email them to the PMI Ethics Member Advisory Group (Ethics MAG): ethics.mag@pmi.org.

The PMI EDMF use is not mandatory; it is a guide for critical thinking while using the ethical decision-making process. Per the PMI EDMF document "Critical to the successful use of the PMI EDMF is the recognition that the answers to the questions raised by the PMI EDMF are the responsibility of the user. The PMI EDMF can also be effectively used at the end of a decision-making process, when a decision is about to be made, to reflectively look back to see if the important steps have been taken and if the important considerations have been made."

The 5 Steps in PMI Ethical Decision-Making Framework give project management professionals guiding questions, tools & techniques as well as a decision diamond to help guide them through each assessment step. It is presented as a logical linear sequence of steps and you will likely find it useful to loop back-and-forth between steps. Remember, the PMI EDMF does not include every possible step or question useful for making an ethical decision. Instead, it is intended to stimulate you to challenge yourself with additional steps and questions.

You can refer to PMI's Ethical Decision-Making Framework document for future reference.

Growing demand for accuracy in requirements management means growing demand for professionals who are qualified in this area of practice — and enthusiastic about it! As with all PMI certifications, the PMI-PBA- beside your name is evidence of your expertise and displays your commitment to your profession and your career.

Developed by professionals who are subject matter experts in business analysis, the PMI-PBA encompasses and reflects research that addresses the specific role business analysis serves that most directly impacts project success. The role of the business analyst may be a dedicated position or part of a position that performs multiple functions — such as a project manager who also manages the requirements.

If you focus on evaluating and analyzing business problems and managing project or program requirements, the PMI-PBA could be right for you. The pilot program is underway (ends 4 August 2014).
